1. Donate Blood: American Red Cross now



faces a severe blood shortage due to an unprecedented number of blood drive cancellations in response to the COVID -19 outbreak. Nearly 2,700 Red Cross blood drives have been canceled across the country due to coronavirus concerns, resulting in some 86,000 fewer blood donations Healthy individuals are needed to donate to help patients counting on lifesaving blood. Individuals can schedule an appointment to give blood with the American Red Cross by visiting RedCrossBlood.org, using the Red Cross Blood Donor App or calling 1-800-RED-CROSS.
